Masterclass takeaways



Below are notes based on the online ABCD Masterclass run by Nurture Development on 16 March 2023.

Community foundations are ideally placed to mobilise assets, as trusted institutions / convenors with:

- Access to resources (physical, financial, human, technical)
- Connections and relationships with relevant stakeholders
- Local knowledge

Don't look for what's wrong but what's strong in communities. Don't think about what a place was or lacks but focus on what it could be - apply social imagination.

Make the neighbourhood / locality the unit of context, not specific issues but rather the combination in each setting, woven together to form a unique tapestry.

Not about prescribing solutions but supporting a process 'to make visible the invisible':

- Discover
- Connect
- Mobilise

This requires a change of mindset and a new approach to philanthropy, shifting from one of replacing scarcity / filling a deficit, to unlocking potential by identifying and releasing assets.

Building blocks of ABCD:

- 1. Stories / culture (identity / common bond of place)
- 2. Institutions involving committed people (with access to assets)
- 3. Map assets, undertake community conversations (listening campaign), based on a sense of place
- 4. Build relationships and connect people and assets (public, private and citizen / community)
- 5. Create a vision and a plan / plans for self-mobilisation / associate action living labs (offering inspiration and opportunities for engagement)
- 6. Lever knowledge and community assets to secure resources from within and outside the locality to invest in local action.
