WHAT WE WANTED TO ACHIEVE IN 2022



- ❖ Learn about the field and share knowledge about it
- Share learning that strengthens the field and in particular that which helps build a leadership role and encourages engagement with the SDGs
- Support CFSO's to find their role and structure
- ❖ New partnerships to prepare the next phase of ECFI





- The post-pandemic situation reallowed to meet in person. As a consequence many CFSOs organised physical conferences. ECFI participated, co-organised or added activities.
- February 24th changed everything: Solidarity with Ukraine became first priority in activities
- Expansion of ECFI reach into new territories in Europe
- Many learnings and insights from field research





ACTIVITIES 2022 IN FIGURES



- In 4 Online-meetings and 3 physical meetings we gathered 157 individuals from 25 countries and shared learnings with 20 learning products from 4 different categories
- ❖ The range of questions topics showed 5 focus areas: Development of the field, connecting with emergent countries, embracing the SDGs and specifically Climate, Solidarity with Ukraine, ECFIs role and future
- Less quantity in contacts, but higher quality in learnings and building relationships



SOLIDARITY WITH UKRAINE

- Connection Building: WhatsApp group quickly connects CFs and CFSOs from all over Europe (40 group members from 8 countries) to help mobilizing support
- ECFI website page and database of support created
- Engagement with Philea 'Philanthropy for Ukraine'
- Capability Building: 1 Online meeting to "CFs and refugees in neighbouring countries" (33 participants from 13 countries) connects CFs with different level of experience in their work with refugees
- 3 Online learning products provided

- Physical meetings came back! Many CFSOs organised national and international in person meetings
- ECFI participated in and co-created:

 - UK-CF conference combined with ECFI Study Visit
 - Bündnis congress and BVDS Day of Foundations
 - Italian CF Conference
 - Romanian Federation Conference
 - Ukrainian CF Conference



EXPANSION OF THE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION FIELD



❖ The first post-covid physical meeting connected 41 practitioners from 5 emergent countries and 4 more established countries

❖ For a first time it enabled practitioners from Spain (established CFs as well as initiative groups) to learn from the national as well as the international peer learning community



- ❖ The interest in online SDG Wake-up calls was low in 2022
- But sustainability was one of the main topics on national conferences
- ❖ ECFI highlighted SDG 13 and relevance on climate crisis to CFs
- ❖ The TM "How can community foundations become part of the solution to the climate crisis?" informed 38 participants from 13 countries
- ❖ The TM leads into the Learning Journey in 2023

LEARNINGS FROM THE FIELD - EVALUATION

- ❖ The field led evaluation report offers meaningful insights to ECFIs role:
 - "ECFI weaves a more connected and consolidated CF Movement in Europe"
 - "ECFI is filling a significant gap in consolidating community philanthropy"
 - "ECFI is giving CFs visibility and recognition"
 - "ECFI acts as a connector toward CFs and CF movements"
 - "For emerging countries ECFI is a source of courage, inspiration, knowledge, partnership, resources of various sorts and connections"




LEARNINGS FROM THE FIELD - FIELD RESEARCH

NEW PARTNERSHIPS FOR 2023 AND 2024

- ❖ The Charles Stewart Mott Foundation approved the renewal of ECFIs proposal for 2023 and 2024
- ECFI worked with Fondation de Lille and the Spanish Association on a new partnership funded by Porticus
- "C2C Citizen to Citizen" starts in January 2023 with ambitious objectives and a European partnership construction:
 - Stronger CF movement in Europe
 - Sustainable CFSOs in emergent countries
 - A CF network in France and a higher number of CFs in France







FUTURE

- With beginning of the Russian invasion into Ukraine, the value of ECFI as a long-term network with established connections and trustful relationships became evident
- CFs and CFSOs want to meet in person!
- The interest in learning from each other was higher than before
- Crisis increases the need of powerful local philanthropy
- The interest into the local philanthropy raises
- ECFI can help building bridges between the local, the national and the global philanthropy



A phase of transition for ECFI from an initiative into part of the mainstream of philanthropy infrastructure in Europe.

Principles guiding ECFI activity:

- Ensure knowledge sharing and learning spaces are open to the community foundation field and relevant stakeholders;
- Ensure that resources produced and curated by ECFI in English are made accessible to all, through adaptation and where appropriate, translation;
- Utilise specialist expertise (including from outside the community foundation field) as required to enhance the learning experience;
- Remain sensitive to the diverse social, economic and political contexts in Europe and to the variety of forms and functions of community foundations that have emerged;
- Be agile and responsive to emerging needs in the field.





- Strengthen connections within the CF and CFSO field;
- Engage with other relevant stakeholders (notably Philea) as appropriate to raise awareness of the potential of CFs;
- In-source (from the field)
- Internationalise national events and activities
